Refugee Health Program

The Refugee Health Program leverages multiple departmental resources to provide essential healthcare service to refugee children and families. Since March 2023, this program has served as the first point of contact for refugees seeking healthcare. The program connects refugees to pediatric care, communicable disease prevention, dental and nutritional support services. Alamance County is one of the top twelve refugee settlement counties in the state.

All Catawba County families can make choices that allow them to live healthy lives. Families are linked to community services and assisted with completing the applications required to receive many services, if needed. Providing information on securing housing, utilities, food and nutrition, transportation resources, employment and vocational rehabilitation, navigation of clinical care systems, insurance and charity care are part of the care given to these families. This peer-support model is linking families with multiple overlapping disparities that affect their health.

Clinical and Community Health

The Parent Navigator Program was designed by Gabriela Arciniega to assist parents whose child is suspected or diagnosed with an intellectual or developmental



disability. The program helps parents navigate systems and services and provides access to resources, services, and support. Medical providers, caregivers, including daycare and school personnel, can refer children to the program. Providing awareness and delivery of services where gaps existed allows these children to reach their full potential.

Baby Store



2024 Local Health Department AWARD

The Baby Store is a health department incentivebased, health promotion program to support moms and their babies. Clients earn "baby bucks" by attending child and maternal health appointments and other educational or healthcare appointments. "Baby bucks" are redeemed to purchase a variety of items including diapers, baby wipes, clothing, car seats, sleep sacks and other needed items. In 2023, Cumberland County setup 897 appointments for the Baby Store.

Duplin County Health Department Child Health



All students entering NC's school system for the first time must have a physical health assessment and be upto-date on immunizations within 30 days of entering school. In partnership with a local medical center and the county school system the health department provides health assessments and immunizations on specific days each month. This collaboration is breaking down barriers for these children and their parents.

Forsyth County Department of Public Health Adolescent Health

Adolescent Health includes three individual teen programs.

- 1) Flourish provides education centered on the use of Smart Girl curriculum and teaches about puberty, decision making, pregnancy and STI prevention.
- 2) Motivating Males on the Move(M3) uses the Wise Guys curriculum to teach about masculinity, communication skills, personal and family values, relationship skills, abstinence and contraception, and STI prevention.
- 3) Unify is a sexual health program and uses the Get Real: Sexual Health curriculum to teach about sexuality, protection methods, STI prevention, relationship skills and how to access health care services.

Forsyth County Department of Public Health Growing Together 2024 Local Health Department AWARD

Forsyth County Department of Public Health has many programs helping lower the risk of chronic diseases and fighting the battle of food insecurity for all ages. Growing Together is a unique 20 lesson curriculum program focused on educating elementary students. These students participate in an after-school gardening program for third to fifth graders. Growing Together utilizes the innovative Learn, Grow, Eat, Go curriculum. Students earn a certificate reminding them of their abilities to grow a garden.

School Health Program/Operation Zero Exclusion

This multi-partner collaboration is increasing immunization and health assessment compliance through on-campus immunizations in underserved communities. The Saturday clinic and a Just-In-Time clinic has improved compliance. This School Health Program to increase immunization and health assessment compliance rates is changing health outcomes in Forsyth County.

Project Zen Den provides sensory relief and respite for children and youth with special health care needs and their families. Sensory tents have been provided for use at community events creating a quiet, safe, and calming environment for children and families in need at local parks and community events. Sensory tents include soft lighting, comfortable seating and quiet surroundings. This program is helping children who suffer from sensory overload.

Safe Kids Jackson County is focused on injury prevention. Local fire and law enforcement, emergency management, community organizations, the local school system and local government agencies are members. In 2023, over 7,100 individuals were reached with 33 events promoting safety, and injury prevention education and trainings across the county.

Newborn Home Visit

Local Health Department Nomination

Newborn/postpartum home visits are a key mechanism for reaching families early with resources, preventive services, and anticipatory guidance. The program provides home visits within the first 28 days after delivery to ease the transition to home for families and infants. During the home visit, an assessment of the newborn and a focused assessment of the mother, including a screening for postpartum depression is completed. Lactation information and support, nutritional guidance, and referrals to other community services are also provided.

STI Express Clinic

Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs) express services refers to triagebased STI testing without a full clinical examination. Asymptomatic patients are routed to less services, and symptomatic patients are seen at that time. These services are provided to patients without other acute health care needs. From August 2023 to June 2024 over 2,160 patients were seen with 1,006 confirmed abnormal labs (46 % positivity rate). This program is working to treat and is slowing the potential spread of STIs in the community.

Rockingham County Department of Public Health Mobile Dental Unit

Launched in Fall 2023, a Mobile Dental Unit is providing school-based dental care to all Title 1 schools in the county. During the 2023-24 school


year, 981 treatments were provided at no cost to the children that met the criteria. The Mobile Dental Unit is helping overcome barriers including a lack of transportation, time away from work for parents, and local dental offices that don't accept Medicaid.

Client and Patient GIS Mapping

Local Health Department Nomination



Using a Geographic Information System(GIS) to overlay anonymized patient data with maps of demographic census data, locations of city and county parks, chronic disease prevalence, and CDC's social vulnerability index provided information needed to combat barriers in marginal communities. The spatial analysis provided crucial insights for effective resource allocation, intervention prioritization, and improving health department service access, to address health inequities.

Transylvania County Department of Public Health TC STRONG 2024 Local Health Department

TC STRONG is a community-based collaborative supporting youth mental health initiatives in the county. TC STRONG is working to help youth feel confident and secure in their connections, purpose, and hope. The collaborative is creating a pathway working to improve the health and resilience of youth and teens in both the short and long term. Key strategies needed in the community to improve mental health include community awareness, education, destigmatization, empowerment and connection, and access to support and care. TC STRONG serves youth in the county.

Public Health Nurse Supervisor II Alamance County Health Department





Chloe Gordon's primary role, TB responsibilities, includes innovative preventive health activities in Gaston County. As a TB nurse she has expanded her role and is a driving force for the Harm Reduction Alliance providing harm reduction kits. These kits are designed to combat preventable health conditions including STI's and opioid overdose. She is working to reduce health disparities while continuing her education, as she is completing an MPH.

Individual Achievement AWARD

Peg O'Connell's expertise as a public health advocate was needed as chair of Care4Carolina. This coalition advocated for Medicaid Expansion and the efforts culminated in the signing of the NC Medicaid Expansion Bill into law. Since March 2023 over 500,000 in our state have been enrolled.
